What is Urban Squash Cleveland?

Urban Squash Cleveland ("USC") is a youth development organization that empowers youth to reach their potential through academic support, the sport of squash and enduring life skills.

Our program is designed to prepare students for the future. USC is a long-term, rigorous and rewarding commitment, full of exciting possibilities and opportunities.

Squash: Through regular practice and competitions, students develop endurance, coordination, physical and mental awareness, and discipline. The fascinating game is a wonderful vehicle that helps open doors and connects our team with meaningful opportunities for personal growth.

Academics: Students engage in homework help, literacy development, financial skill-building, ACT & SAT tutoring and college support as they cultivate a lifelong love of learning and pursue meaningful post-secondary opportunities.

Enrichment: Team members participate in unique culinary and agricultural experiences, field trips, internships, camps and travel to cities and colleges across the country as they form relationships with mentors, volunteers and one another.



USC is part of the Squash & Education Alliance (SEA), which is a network of 20 programs nationwide and 5 international affiliates. 98% of SEA students who stay in member programs graduate from high school and enroll in post-secondary schools, in a network with a total of 2,500+ year round team members enrolled.

Currently serving a total of 50 students between 6th and 12th grades and 13 alumni, Urban Squash Cleveland plans to grow steadily over the next seven years to ultimately serve a total of 85 children each year.

A Year of Adapting

USC was fortunate to run in-person and virtual programming during the last school year. Small group, socially distant sessions emphasized social-emotional development and enabled team members to hone their fundamentals on the squash court, build their academic skills, deepen connections with peers and mentors, and have fun.

Squash Health cooking classes, student-led town halls, interactive game sessions, and college support sessions were essential components of our online programming experience, helping student-athletes strengthen their development.

USC continued to prioritize individualized attention for students and their families, which included weekly 1:1 communication, grocery delivery, clothing donation and technology support.



The Cleveland Foundation partnership

In December of 2020, USC started an endowment fund, managed by Clearstead, at the Cleveland Foundation.



This partnership strengthens USC's position in the community, providing financial sustainability to our organization. The endowment fund also helps us accomplish strategic milestones that allow us to focus on operational goals.

USC Becomes a member of the Community Affiliate Network

Launched in collaboration with US Squash in 2021, the Community Affiliate Network has become a reality. Urban Squash Cleveland joined the CAN and became its fourth national member, and the first in the Midwest.

The Community Affiliate Network (CAN) establishes formal relationships between US Squash and non-profit facilities such as USC, advancing the goals of the Community Initiative, delivering US Squash programs and closely aligning with US Squash's mission of promoting squash's growth and development by increasing access and awareness, supporting meaningful lifelong engagement in the sport, and encouraging sportsmanship while achieving competitive excellence. Like other CAN facilities, USC conducts programming inclusive of junior squash grassroots development and high-performance programs, squash and education

programs, adult squash development, and accredited leagues, ladders, and tournaments to provide access to squash for all.

With the youth development organization at the core of USC's mission, the Community Initiative adds access and lifelong engagement in squash to people spanning the entire socio-economic spectrum, fostering lasting relationships across generations, genders, races and religions and building a lasting community rooted in shared values.

Our multicultural, multigenerational space joins many community squash centers across the US, in an effort that will dramatically increase access to the sport and bring a growing and diverse community together.


