What is Urban Squash Cleveland?

Urban Squash Cleveland ("USC") is a youth development organization that empowers youth to reach their potential through academic support, the sport of squash, and enduring life skills.

Our program is designed to prepare students for the future. USC is a long-term, rigorous, and rewarding commitment, full of exciting possibilities and opportunities.

Squash: Through regular practice and competitions, students develop endurance, coordination, physical and mental awareness, and discipline. The fascinating game is a wonderful vehicle that helps open doors and connects our team with meaningful opportunities for personal growth.

Academic Support: Students engage in homework help, literacy development, financial skill-building, ACT & SAT tutoring, and college support as they cultivate a lifelong love of learning and pursue meaningful post-secondary opportunities.

Enrichment: Team members participate in unique culinary and agricultural experiences, field trips, internships, camps, wellness sessions, and travel to cities and colleges across the country as they form relationships with mentors, volunteers, and one another.




USC is part of the Squash & Education Alliance (SEA), a network of 19 member programs in cities across the U.S. and 5 international affiliates. 94% of SEA students who stay in member programs graduate from high school and enroll in post-secondary schools, in a network with a total of 2,500+ year round team members enrolled.


Currently serving a total of 34 students between 5th and 12th grades and 15 alumni, Urban Squash Cleveland is heavily recruiting new team members during the 2022-2023 school year, aiming to reach a total of over 50 students (December 2022), as well as expanding its outreach over the next 5 years to ultimately serve a total of 85 team members each year.

2021 - 2022 Highlights

Back to Action!

USC was fortunate to return to full, in-person, programming during our 2021-2022 season, including tournament opportunities and summer programming. Team members reconnected with one another on and off the court, with a heavy emphasis on social-emotional development and team building throughout programming.

In an effort to hone in on our team members social and emotional well-being in a post-pandemic environment, Squash the Stress was formally introduced to programming and led by Dr. Vincent Caringi, a local child and adolescent psychiatrist. His time has been spent with our student-athletes focusing on their mental health and ways to manage stress, teaching ways in which they can cope with these stressors through mindfulness exercises. Our team members have been able to apply these techniques throughout a multi-week program that also teaches them about the physiology and science of stress.

Team members continued identifying and establishing healthy choices and refining their cooking skills through 6 unique cooking sessions with Squash Health, part of the special enrichment program launched in collaboration with Spice Field Kitchen. The program emphasizes the connection between culture, health, food and the environment. Students learned to prepare meals that are not only a healthy choice, but budget-friendly, and can be customized and shared with their families. Instilling a love for cooking has enabled USC team members to gain independence and allow them to immerse themselves in the magic of cooking within their own homes, as well as on team trips.

For the first time in over 2 years, our studentathletes had the opportunity to travel again and compete in tournaments. Studentathletes traveled to Rhode Island for the High Performance Team trials and Philadelphia



for both SEA Team Nationals and Individual Nationals. These opportunities allowed our team members to reconnect with one another and help USC thrive as a unit.

USC also led a successful 3-week summer camp with engaging opportunities for team members. Summer programming enabled students to develop athletically, socially, as well as give back to their community through various community service projects. Team members participated in activities that included gardening, exploring and learning the history of several Cleveland landmarks, hiking, and improving their squash play and fitness.

Introducing Cleveland Community Squash



In 2021, USC joined US Squash's Community Affiliate Network, becoming the first member program in the Midwest and the fourth national member. As a result, USC launched Cleveland Community Squash in the Spring of 2022, a membership-based program that supplements, supports and creates pathways of growth for USC's team of student-athletes.

Cleveland Community Squash is a community squash club based in USC that aims to provide access to the sport and lifelong engagement in squash to people spanning the entire socio-economic spectrum. CCS fosters lasting relationships across generations, genders, races and religions, and builds a strong community rooted in shared values.

Since the spring, Cleveland Community Squash has grown to 50+ active members—a number we expect to see increase in the coming months. Because of the unique relationship between CCS and USC, members often spend time volunteering during USC's afterschool programming. Both USC and CCS benefit from the additional opportunities this presents for our student-athletes and members to compete in friendly matches on the squash court and build relationships off it.

CCS offers activities at affordable rates, including access to leagues, lessons, clinics, camps and squash events. Squash players of all ages can join and become members to enjoy the funfilled environment led by our Director of Squash, Duncan Steele.


